SAMPLE COURSES

Practicum in Curatorial Studies/Special Studies in Cultural Theories and Practices This course combines the theory and practice of curatorial work, public history and experiential learning for students interested in achieving a university credit by working with a local museum or art gallery. Students are expected to work 6 hours a week in the host institution, as well as attend classes once a week, for a more theoretical perspective. Partnerships opportunities include local galleries and museums.

The Idea of the Museum Museums do more than just collect art objects; they display and produce culture. This course examines the collecting practices of Western museums, before and after the Enlightenment, as well as ideologies of collecting.
